## Reflections on 2023

For 2023, we set ourselves the goal of expanding our audience reach beyond younger girls and to develop new programmes to help improve inclusivity in the Cornish TEC scene.

It's been a busy year of experimentation, learning and continuous improvement and we are so proud of the impact we have achieved during 2023 as we have moved into working more closely with secondary school age girls and with women looking to join the tech sector.

Of the many new programmes we launched in 2023, the one that we are most proud of is the digitalUPLIFT programme launched in partnership with Truro & Penwith College. We knew that women were interested in finding out more about the opportunities within the tech sector and we knew that if we designed a programme for them; removing all the potential barriers that we could think of, that they would come. And they did! When the programme launched, we were blown away by the response and we had to close sign-ups for the first cohort and promise to run a second one!

The digitalUPLIFT programme has been a success on so many levels. There is the obvious impact of raising the skills and confidence of over 60 women and supporting 8 women into tech jobs, but we've also grown our TECwomen network and expanded our partnerships with local, inspirational employers, who share the TECwomen values. It was the icing on the cake to have received external recognition for the programme in November by us winning the Tech South-West 'Commitment to Talent' award.

As with all our programmes, this would not have been possible without the generous support from our sponsors and we are so appreciative of their support to make this programme happen.

This report has been produced to share the impact that we've had this year and celebrate all that has been achieved and recognise our sponsors. It details our 2023 projects under the TECgirls, TECwomen and digitalUPLIFT brands and demonstrates the impact and legacy they have achieved.



As we look ahead to 2024, it won't surprise you that we still have a bigger ambition beyond what we currently have funding to deliver!



## TECgirls Green Futures Jam: Feedback

"The TECgirls Green Future Jam promised to be an exciting and engaging experience for year 8 girls to show them how technology, engineering and coding/apps specifically can be used to make the world a better place, and it did not disappoint! The TECgirls Green Future event, hosted at The Eden Project, was for year 8 girls from schools across Cornwall, over one hundred girls in total. It was a very exciting day with lots planned for the students to take part in.

Although neither of Helston teams' pitches won the each of the girls took part in every element of the day with 100% effort. They demonstrated exceptional teamwork, innovation and communication. The girls left the event full of confidence and in high spirits. They continued to speak about the day to their friends in school over the next month or so. All of their computing teachers noted how much more confident they were in class when tackling tasks and answering questions.

At least seven out of the ten girls are seriously considering GCSE Computer Science when they make their option choices later this term; in addition to the twenty-two of their peers. As I also head up Engineering as part of the Technology & Enterprise Faculty the girls have embraced all aspects of design technology with renewed enthusiasm. I wish I could provide this experience for all the girls in Y8 it had such an impact on them and their immediate friendship groups."

The digitalUPLIFT programme is a proven 8-week skills development programme designed for women, to showcase the opportunities within Cornwall's tech/digital sector and support women into tech/digital jobs or onto a training pathway towards one.

It's more than a course as participants are also connected with local tech employers, industry mentors and the TECwomen community. Key successes for the first two cohorts in 2023 include:








#### **Eco-sensor workshops in schools**
